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
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Adelaide Hills

Adelaide Hills has a well-deserved reputation as one of Australia's most exciting cool climate areas. Due to its altitude the region is significantly cooler than its neighbours which, when paired with long dry summers and autumns, leads to wonderful natural acidity in the fruit. European varietals thrive in these conditions - Pinot Noir, Grüner-Veltliner and many Italian varietals.

Bird in Hand

Barossa Valley

Arguably Australia's best-known wine region, The Barossa, made up of both the Barossa and Eden Valleys, sits to the north-east of Adelaide. While so close geographically, the climates of these two regions couldn't be more different. The sun-kissed vineyards of Barossa favour the production of bold red wines, with Shiraz and other Rhône varietals taking centre stage.

Clare Valley

Nestled in the northern Mt Lofty Ranges, the Clare Valley is a boutique wine region with a distinguished reputation for its world-class Riesling. The area features high altitude and a continental climate resulting in considerable temperature variations from day to night. The cold nights, elevated sites, and unique soils, allows for cool ripening in the fruit, helping to retain natural acidity, which contributes to the regions success with Riesling and in more recent years demonstrating the diversity of *terroir* by introducing new wave varietals to the region.

Coonawarra

Famed for its iron-rich, rust-coloured *terra rossa* soil, Coonawarra can also thank pure underground water, a limestone bedrock, cool nights and a long, mild growing season for the success and complexity of its wines. Since the renaissance of the region in the 1950s, it has become known for producing world-class red wines, with a firm focus on Cabernet Sauvignon.

Trentham Estate

Heathcote

A 90-minute drive north of Melbourne, the vines of Heathcote are grown on the ancient red Cambrian soils of the region, known for their excellent water retention qualities. Combined with warm summers tempered by cool southerly winds, Heathcote is renowned for its premium rich, earthy Shiraz, from grapes that thrive in these conditions.

Trentham Estate

Langhorne Creek

Another of Australia's oldest wine regions with a winemaking history of over 150 years, Langhorne Creek can boast the world's oldest officially-recorded Cabernet Sauvignon vineyard, dating from 1891. While the region is known for its bold, intensely rich red varietals, it has also seen a great deal of success with Verdelho, Chardonnay and Fiano.

Bremerton

McLaren Vale

Just 15 miles south of Adelaide, McLaren Vale was one of South Australia's original wine regions, with the first vineyard established in 1838. The climate is mediterranean, tempered by the Mount Lofty ranges to the north and the Gulf St Vincent to the west, both of which create climatic diversity within the region. Italian varietals are producing memorable wines.

Murray Darling

Often overlooked in favour of the better-known regions, Murray Darling plays an important role in Australia's wine production. With a hot, dry climate, producers rely on the nurturing water of the nearby Murray River to allow their vines to thrive. The wines produced are richly flavoured and characterful, testament to the commitment and investment of recent years.

Tasmania

Tasmania enjoys a maritime climate with mild summers and long autumn days, and a latitude comparable to that of southern France. The Tamar Valley in northern Tasmania is responsible for just under half the region's production, with an emphasis on Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. Here, the shallow, stony soils and cool climate result in consistently high quality fruit.

Trentham Estate

Western Australia/Margaret River

Margaret River is the major G.I. wine region in south-west Western Australia, with 5,017 hectares under vine. Although the region produces just 3% of total Australian grape production, it produces over 20% of Australia's premium wines. The climate is more strongly maritime influenced than any other major Australian region, with the lowest mean annual temperature range as well as the most marked Mediterranean climate in terms of rainfall.

Capel Vale

Yarra Valley

Victoria's first wine growing district and is recognised as one of Australia's foremost cool climate wine producing areas, with around 2,536 hectares under vine. The soils of the middle Yarra Valley are ancient, mountain-derived sandy clay loams with broken sandstone and younger volcanic red soils are found in the Upper and Lower areas. The region is cooler than Bordeaux but warmer than Burgundy, with an elevation that varies from 50 metres to 400 metres. Limited maritime influence and the small diurnal temperature range reflects the proximity to the sea.

Central Otago

Central Otago is the world's most southerly wine-producing region, experiencing a more extreme climate than New Zealand's other areas. The summers are hot and dry, and the winters crisp and snowy. Soil structure is also very different with heavy mineral deposits in silt loams. Its Pinot Noirs are among the most impressive expressions of the variety in the New World.

Marlborough

Recognised as one of the great winemaking regions of the world, Marlborough can thank its unique *terroir* - broad alluvial plains, the influence of the Pacific Ocean and the climatic protection of mountain ranges to the north and south - for its continued success. No longer simply known for its Sauvignon Blanc, the region's wines are famed for their purity, minerality and expression of fruit.

Martinborough

Until recently a sleepy colonial town, today Martinborough is producing world class wines to critical acclaim with a reputation that far exceeds the region's output - just one per cent of New Zealand's wine production. With a cool climate, mineral rich soils and low rainfall, Martinborough has one of the longest growing seasons in NZ, resulting in great intensity of flavour in the finished wines.

Escarpment

Waipara

Situated 40 minutes north of Christchurch on the South Island, Waipara Valley is fast becoming one of New Zealand's premium wine-producing regions. Vines were first planted in the 1980s, with over 1300ha now established; predominantly Pinot Noir and aromatic white varieties. A range of soils and the natural sun trap of the valley are producing award-winning wine.




Ceres Plateau has only recently been made part of the Wine of Origin scheme with just 40ha currently planted to vine. The unique climate is continental, with cool evenings and warm days – perfect conditions for developing Pinot Noir with style and elegance.

Constantia

Constantia's excellent wine estates stretch all the way up the south-eastern sides of the Constantiaberg mountain and the vineyards are among the steepest in South Africa. Both the shade of the mountain and the constant sea breezes contribute to lower average temperatures on the slopes, helping the grapes retain their fresh acidity. The constant buffeting of the south-easterly winds stresses the vines, causing them to dig deeper into the decomposed granite soils for nutrients. A high clay content retains water and helps keep the vines hydrated during the dry summers.

Darling

Darling was named a Wine of Origin district in 2003, when it was deemed to be producing wines of sufficient diversity to those of Swartland to merit it. Gnarled bush vines dominate the region which is heavily influenced by the Atlantic - early morning fogs and cool evenings help the grapes retain acidity while developing aromatic complexity and concentration of flavour.

Darling Cellars

Elgin

Separated from Stellenbosch by the Hottentot Mountains, Elgin enjoys a cool climate as a result of both its altitude and proximity to the South Atlantic Ocean. The lower temperatures and early morning mist favour aromatic varieties such as Riesling, Pinot Noir, Gewurztraminer and Sauvignon Blanc which display fine minerality and expression of fruit.

Piekenierskloof

Another high altitude area, Piekenierskloof lies approximately 100 miles to the north of Cape Town, at 500m above sea level. The natural heat of the area is cooled in late afternoon by the Berg Wind (mountain wind), which blows from the plateau down to the coast with beneficial effects on the ripening grapes, allowing them to develop complexity and balance.







Casablanca Valley

Located 50 miles from Santiago and a short distance from the Pacific Ocean, the Casablanca Valley climate is moderated by coastal breezes that cool the warm summer temperatures, creating ideal conditions for the slow ripening of fruit. Poor, finely-textured sandy/alluvial soils retain minimal moisture, restricting yields and producing intense, concentrated wines.

Carriage will be charged at cost for smaller orders. These are dispatched by courier and are sent at the customer's risk. Prices for this service on application. Please note that we do not accept back orders. Any out of stock items will not be sent individually on arrival but may be added to a subsequent minimum order.
3. Collection allowance: A collection allowance of £2.00 ex VAT per 12 x 75cl (or equivalent). The wines are stored in Seabrook Warehousing, 853 London Road, West Thurrock, RM20 3LG.
4. Orders
 - 4.1 Purchases under bond: Deduct duty at current rate. From 1st Feb 2026: £30.62 per litre of alcohol in the product.
 - 4.2 Standard delivery terms: Confirmed order details must be received by 12 noon on day 0; delivery by day 4. Please note the following surcharges for special arrangement deliveries: morning delivery - £15; timed delivery - £20. Next day delivery, small vehicle requirements and any other special arrangements may also incur a surcharge - please ask the office for details.
 - 4.3 Amendments to orders: Any orders amended once processed by our warehouse will incur a £15 surcharge for relanding.
5. Payment terms: Credit terms for payment in full by the end of the month following the month in which the goods are delivered. We reserve the right to withdraw credit facilities on overdue accounts and charge interest daily at the rate of 1.5% per month on outstanding amounts. All amounts due for goods supplied must be paid by in full without any set-off, counterclaim, deduction or withholding (other than any deduction or withholding of tax as required by law). On the occurrence of any of the events mentioned in clause 8 below, all sums due shall immediately become payable, notwithstanding that any period(s) of credit allowed may not have expired.
6. Claims on delivery: All goods must be checked by the Buyer on delivery. Claims for breakages and/or missing bottles or cases must be noted in writing on the consignment note or hand-held electronic device at the time of delivery and notified to us within 48 hours. Damaged bottles and packaging must be kept for inspection. Claims for total non-delivery must be notified to us within seven working days of the agreed date of dispatch. Failure to comply with these requirements will entitle us to reject the relevant claim for loss, damage or non-delivery.

7. Retention of Title

- 7.1 In clauses 7 to 9 Company means Seckford Agencies Limited, and the Buyer means the purchaser of goods sold by us (Goods) to the Buyer under a contract (Contract) governed by these Terms and Conditions (Conditions).
- 7.2 The risk in the Goods shall pass to the Buyer on completion of delivery.
- 7.3 Legal title to the Goods shall not pass to the Buyer until the Company has received payment in full in respect of:
 - 7.3.1 the Goods; and
 - 7.3.2 any other goods or services that the Company has supplied to the Buyer.
- 7.4 Until title to the Goods passes, the Buyer shall hold them on a fiduciary basis as bailee for the Company, insure them against all risks for at least their full price, and keep them in good condition, separately stored and readily identifiable as the Company's property.
- 7.5 Subject to clause 7.6, the Buyer may use or resell the Goods in the ordinary course of its business, but may not resell the Goods to a company which is a member of its corporate group, or to any other person to or with whom it is connected or associated, without the prior consent in writing of the Company.
- 7.6 The Buyer's right to possession of the Goods, and its right to use or resell them, shall terminate immediately on the occurrence of any of the events mentioned in clause 8 below.
- 7.7 Upon termination of the Buyer's right to possession of the Goods the Buyer shall, when so required by the Company, immediately and at its expense deliver up the Goods to the Company or as it may direct, free from any lien or other encumbrance.
- 7.8 The Buyer grants the Company, its agents and employees an irrevocable licence at any time to enter any premises of the Buyer, or to which the Buyer has a right of access, where Goods belonging to the Company are or may be stored, in order to inspect any such Goods and, if the Buyer's right to possession has terminated, to re-take possession of them.
- 7.9 Where the Company is unable to determine whether the Buyer has paid for particular Goods, all relevant goods shall be deemed to have been sold by the Company to the Buyer in the order in which they were invoiced to the Buyer.
- 7.10 If the Buyer fails to pay the price of the Goods on or by the due date the Company may bring an action for payment of the price notwithstanding that title to the Goods has not passed to the Buyer.

8. Events of default

The Buyer ceases to trade or becomes insolvent, or any execution is levied on its property, or any proceeding or court application is commenced which relates or could lead to the insolvency of the Buyer; or the Buyer is in breach of any of its obligations under this or any other contract with the Company, or commits any other unlawful act against the Company.

9. Limitations of liability

- 9.1 Claim means and includes any claim for any loss arising under or in connection with any Contract, whether in contract, tort (including negligence), breach of statutory duty, or otherwise.
- 9.2 Subject to clause 9.5, the Company shall not be liable to the Buyer in respect of any Claim unless written particulars of that Claim are notified by the Buyer to the Company within one year after the date of delivery of the Goods.
- 9.3 Subject to clause 9.5:
 - 9.3.1 the Company shall under no circumstances whatever be liable to the Buyer for any loss of profit, or any indirect or consequential loss arising under or in connection with any Contract; and
 - 9.3.2 the Company's total liability to the Buyer in respect of all other losses arising under or in connection with the Contract, whether in contract, tort (including negligence), breach of statutory duty, or otherwise, shall in no circumstances exceed the price of the Goods.
- 9.4 Except as set out in these Conditions, and subject to clause 9.5, all warranties, conditions and other terms implied by statute or common law are, to the fullest extent permitted by law, excluded from the Contract.
- 9.5 Nothing in these Conditions shall limit or exclude the Company's liability for:

 - 9.5.5 any matter in respect of which it would be unlawful for the Company to exclude or restrict liability.
